OUR MISSION


ROMA

Results Oriented Management and Accountability (ROMA) is a results-oriented/evidence-based system of organizational management developed by the Community Action network to comprehensively evaluate community needs and leverage resources from federal, state, local, and private sectors to strategically address these issues.

The basic principles of ROMA include the following:

- 1. Development of a comprehensive assessment of community needs and resources
- 2. Development of a strategic plan based on the community assessment
- 3. Implementation of the organization's strategic plan
- 4. Observation and reporting of results
- 5. Program evaluation

The National Community Action Theory of Change was released by the network in 2017 as a graphical representation of the core principles, performance management framework, and services/strategies implemented and led by the Network to achieve the goals of Community Action across the nation.



This Community Needs Assessment was developed using input from key stakeholders including clients, community members, staff members, and board members using the following methods:

- 1. A survey tool was developed for clients and staff members to complete online.
- 2. A survey tool was developed for Board members and community stakeholders to complete online.

About Passaic County



A total of 503,637 people live in the 186.01 square mile Passaic County area defined for this assessment according to the U.S. Census Bureau American Community Survey 2015-19 5-year estimates. The population density for this area, estimated at 2,708 persons per square mile, is greater than the national average population density of 92 persons per square mile.

Total unemployment in the Passaic County, NJ area for the current month equals 13,568, or 5.5% of the civilian non-institutionalized population age 16 and older (non-seasonally adjusted). This indicator is relevant because unemployment creates financial instability and barriers to access including insurance coverage, health services, healthy food, and other necessities that contribute to poor health status.

This indicator reports median household income based on the latest 5-year American Community Survey estimates for Passaic County, NJ. This includes the income of the householder and all other individuals 15 years old and over in the household, whether they are related to the householder or not. Because many households consist of only one person, average household income is usually less than average family income. There are 165,429 households in the report area, with an average income of \$93,352 and median income of \$69,688.

Within the Passaic County, NJ area 15.69% or 77,841 individuals are living in households with income below the Federal Poverty Level (FPL). This indicator is relevant because poverty creates barriers to access including health services, healthy food, and other necessities that contribute to poor health status.

Based on US census data (2016-2020), the median household income for the City of Passaic, NJ is \$44,779 and the poverty rate is 27.1%.

28.17% of the population aged 25 and older, or 94,039 have obtained a Bachelor's level degree or higher. This indicator is relevant because educational attainment has been linked to positive health outcomes.

The adjusted cohort graduation rate (ACGR) is a graduation metric that follows a "cohort" of first-time 9th graders in a particular school year, and adjust this number by adding any students who transfer into the cohort after 9th grade and subtracting any students who transfer out, emigrate to another country, or pass away. The ACGR is the percentage of the students in this cohort who graduate within four years. In the report area, the adjusted cohort graduation rate was 82.6% during the most recently reported school year. Students in the report area performed worse than the state, which had an ACGR of 89.4%.

Within the report area there are 54,276 persons aged 25 and older without a high school diploma (or equivalency) or higher. This represents 16.26% of the total population aged 25 and older. This indicator is relevant because educational attainment is linked to positive health outcomes (Freudenberg & Ruglis, 2007).

According to US census data (2016-2020) for the City of Passaic, NJ, 67% of persons over age 25 have a high school diploma and 15.1% of persons over age 25 have a Bachelor's degree or higher.

This indicator reports information about formal evictions based on court records from 48 states and the District of Columbia, compiled by the Eviction Lab. The number evictions and eviction filings within the report area is shown in below. The "filing rate" is the ratio of the number of evictions filed in an area over the number of renter-occupied homes in that area. An "eviction rate" is the subset of those homes that received an eviction judgment in which renters were ordered to leave. For the year 2016, the Eviction Lab reports that, of 81,327 homes in the report area, there were 10,268 eviction filings, for an eviction filing rate of 12.63%. 13 of the eviction filings ended in an eviction, for an eviction rate of 0.02%.

Note: Not all counties have data that has been provided. Indicator data do not include information about "informal evictions", or those that happen outside of the courtroom.

This indicator reports the percentage of the households where housing costs are 30% or more of total household income. This indicator provides information on the cost of monthly housing expenses for owners and renters. The information offers a measure of housing affordability and excessive shelter costs. The data also serve to aid in the development of housing programs to meet the needs of people at different economic levels. Of the 165,429 total households in the report area, 74,626 or 45.11% of the population live in cost burdened households.

This indicator reports the number and percentage of owner- and renter-occupied housing units having at least one of the following conditions: 1) lacking complete plumbing facilities, 2) lacking complete kitchen facilities, 3) with 1 or more occupants per room, 4) selected monthly owner costs as a percentage of household income greater than 30%, and 5) gross rent as a percentage of household income greater than 30%. Selected conditions provide information in assessing the quality of the housing inventory and its occupants. This data is used to easily identify homes where the quality of living and housing can be considered substandard. Of the 165,429 total occupied housing units in the report area, 77,345 or 46.75% have one or more substandard conditions.




What is your age?


What is your education level?




What are the causes of poverty in your community?



Are services for the homeless population needed in your community? 297 responses




Is rental and/or mortgage assistance needed in your community? 302 responses




Is there a need for a home repair program (roof replacement, wheelchair ramps, etc) in your community?




Is there a need for after school/youth services in your community? 297 responses




Is there a need for child care in your community?




Is there a need for home delivered meals for homebound residents in your community? 302 responses




Is there a need for utility assistance in your community? 301 responses




Is there a need for immigrant counseling services in your community? 299 responses



Is there a need for free income tax preparation services in your community? 304 responses




Is there a need for job training in your community? 303 responses
